



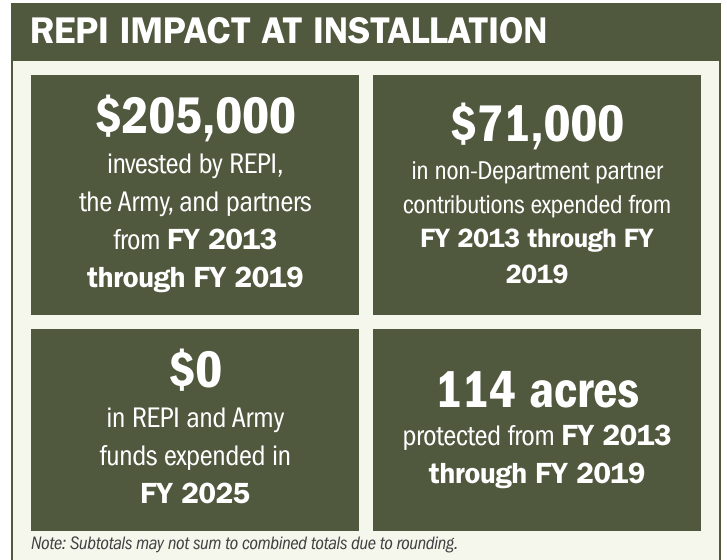
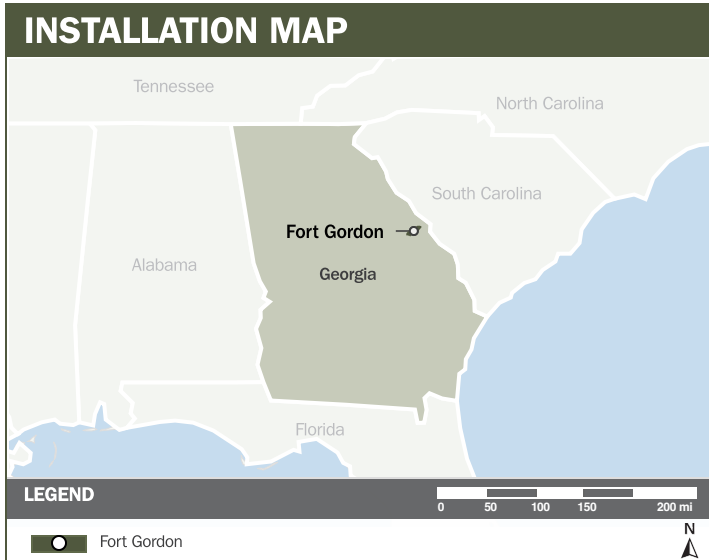
# FORT GORDON

## ABOUT THE INSTALLATION

Fort Gordon, located in Augusta, Georgia, is the Army's premier communications training center and the focal point for developing tactical communications and information systems across the Signal Corps and Signals Intelligence enterprise. The installation also hosts a new National Security Agency facility, which has brought significant workforce growth and associated development pressures in the surrounding region. In addition to its communications mission, Fort Gordon supports a wide range of light-to-heavy-maneuver and live-fire training activities across its training ranges.

## STRENGTHENING MISSION READINESS THROUGH REPI INVESTMENTS

The Department of War (DoW) Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program has played a critical role in supporting Fort Gordon's long-term operational success. Through strategic land conservation and partnership-driven investments, REPI funding helps prevent incompatible development, preserve training flexibility, and maintain mission-critical capabilities beyond the installation boundary.



## PROJECT OVERVIEW

### INCOMPATIBLE DEVELOPMENT—10 U.S.C. § 2684A

- Fort Gordon is surrounded by expanding highway corridors and regional growth from Augusta, bringing development pressures that continue to close in around the installation.
- These encroachment threats contribute to complaints about noise and vibrations from artillery and other live-fire activities, as well as air-quality concerns related to smoke from training obscurants and prescribed burning of longleaf pine habitat and underbrush.
- To address these threats, Fort Gordon leveraged REPI Program funds under 10 U.S.C. § 2684a to protect critical undeveloped forested areas near their ranges, helping reduce the risk of encroachment and preserving the installation's ability to conduct essential training.

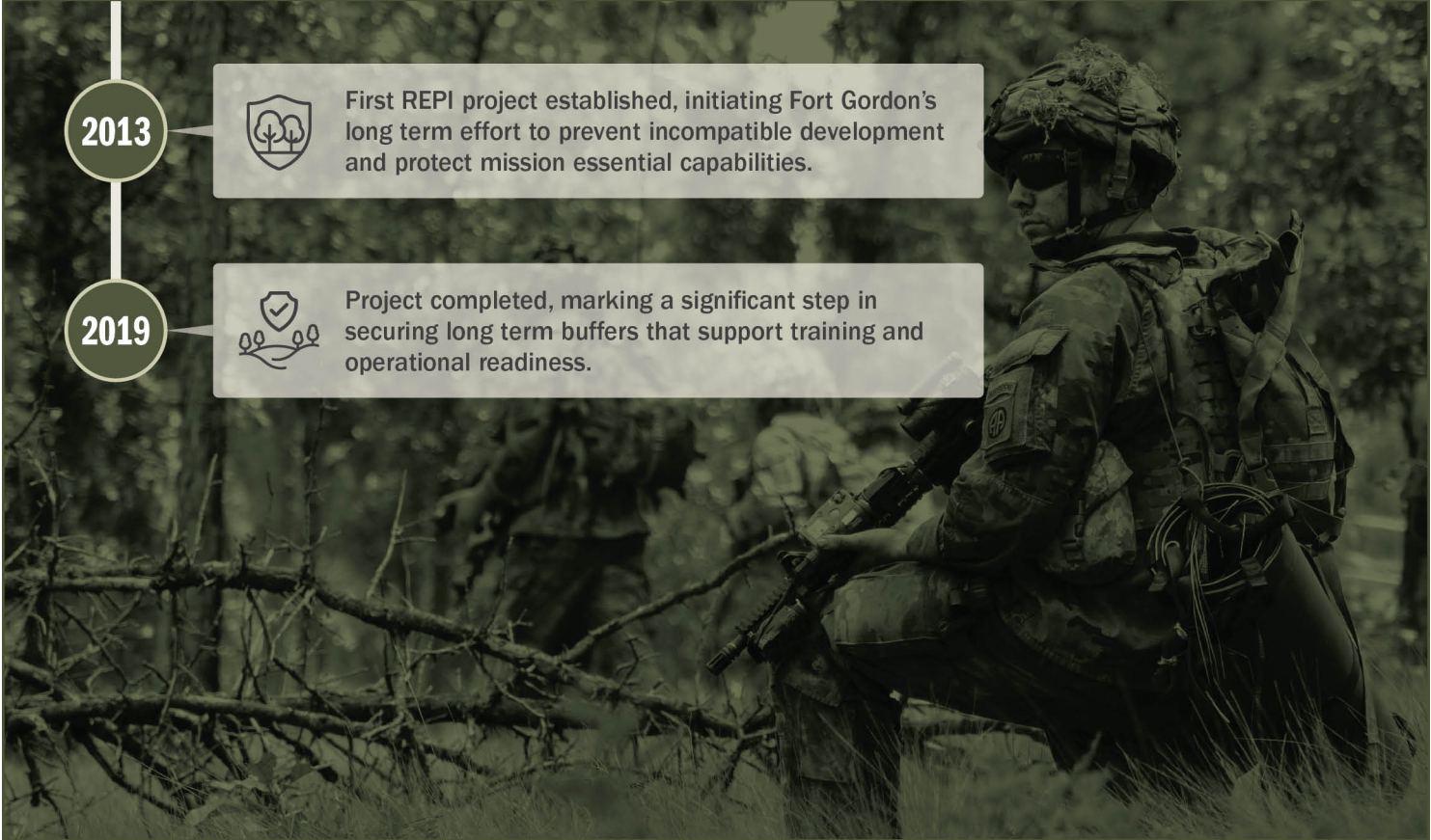


First REPI project established, initiating Fort Gordon's long term effort to prevent incompatible development and protect mission essential capabilities.
