

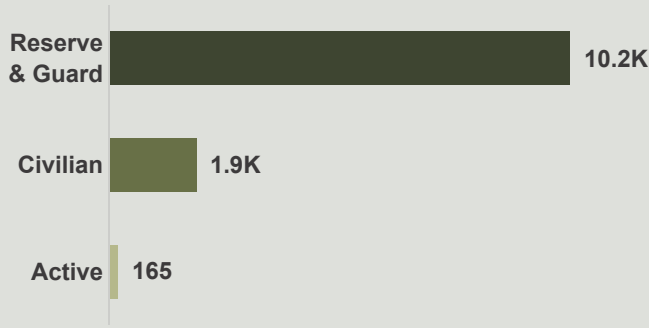
OVERVIEW

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2024, the state of Iowa received \$3.8 billion in Defense spending, which provides direct funding for the Department of War (DoW) personnel salaries, defense contracts, and construction of military facilities in the state. This spending by DoW personnel, contractors, and their families creates significant economic activity, attracts related industries and investments, and generates important state and local government tax revenues.

The Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program is a key tool used by DoW and its partners to protect the military's ability to train, test, and operate in the state. The Department created the REPI Program in response to the development of lands and loss of habitat in the vicinity of or affecting its installations, ranges, and airspace that can lead to restrictions or costly and inadequate training and testing alternatives. Through the REPI Program, DoW works with state and local governments, conservation organizations, and willing private landowners to address these challenges to the military mission and the viability of DoW installations and ranges. The REPI Program has benefited from broad bipartisan support both in the U.S. Congress and among groups representing state and local officials. In FY 2025, DoW and its partners have contributed over \$1.6 million to REPI projects supporting one installation in Iowa.

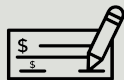

(as of 30 Sept 2024)



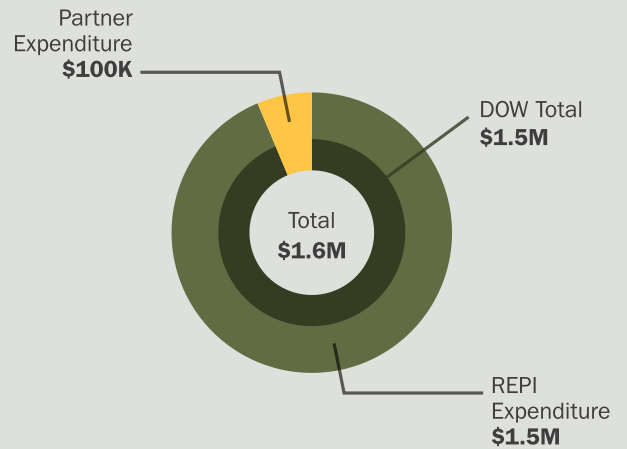

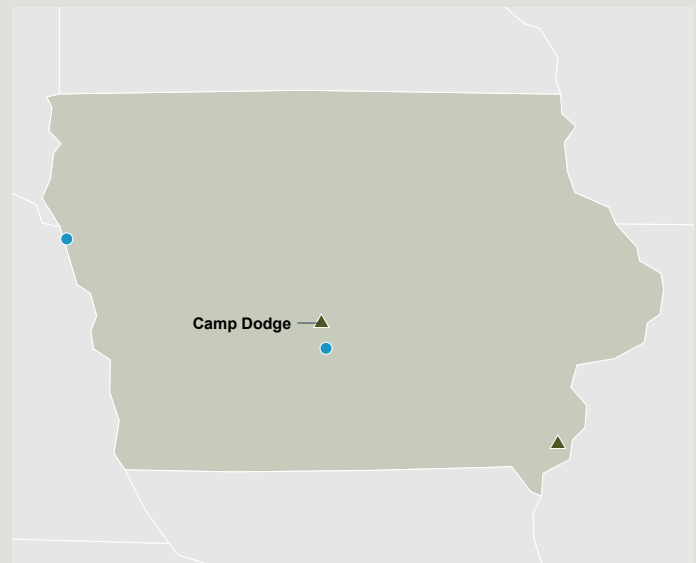

REPI Installations and Ranges

MILITARY PRESENCE

- Camp Dodge Joint Maneuver Training Center (CDJMTC) is the major training facility of the Iowa Army National Guard and the only military training facility in Iowa. Average throughput from 2016 to 2020 was over 425,000 man-days per year, making CDJMTC the 4th most utilized training center in the National Guard.
- CDJMTC provides training support for the 7,000 Soldiers in the Iowa Army National Guard’s six major subordinate commands. It also supports the 1,000 Airmen of the Iowa Air National Guard’s 132nd and 185th Wings.
- CDJMTC is geographically located in the central part of the state, providing efficient access to its training resources for Iowa National Guard units. The nearest alternative training sites are Fort McCoy in Wisconsin (300 miles), Fort Riley in Kansas (325 miles), Camp Ripley in Minnesota (350 miles), and Fort Leonard Wood in Missouri (350 Miles).
- In 2023, the Iowa National Guard deployed 384 Soldiers and 358 Airmen on federal missions within the U.S. and to areas across the world.
