



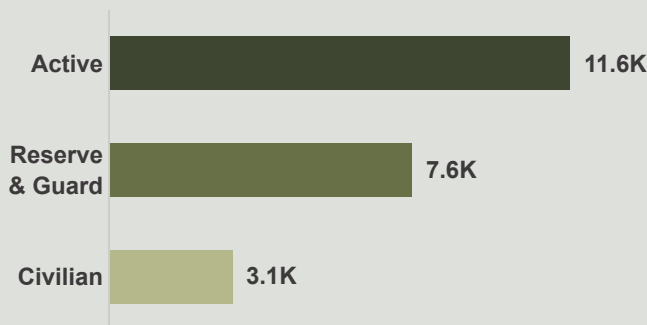
OVERVIEW

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2024, the state of Nevada received approximately \$3.6 billion in Defense spending, which provides direct funding for the Department of War (DoW) personnel salaries, defense contracts, and construction of military facilities in the state. This spending by DoW personnel, contractors, and their families creates significant economic activity, attracts related industries and investments, and generates important state and local government tax revenues.

The Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program is a key tool used by DoW and its partners to protect the military's ability to train, test, and operate in the state. The Department created the REPI Program in response to the development of lands and loss of habitat in the vicinity of or affecting its installations, ranges, and airspace that can lead to restrictions or costly and inadequate training and testing alternatives. Through the REPI Program, DoW works with state and local governments, conservation organizations, and willing private landowners to address these challenges to the military mission and the viability of DoW installations and ranges. The REPI Program has benefited from broad bipartisan support both in the U.S. Congress and among groups representing state and local officials. From FY 2006 through FY 2025, DoW and its partners have contributed nearly \$33.8 million to REPI projects supporting two installations in Nevada.

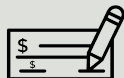

(as of 30 Sept 2024)



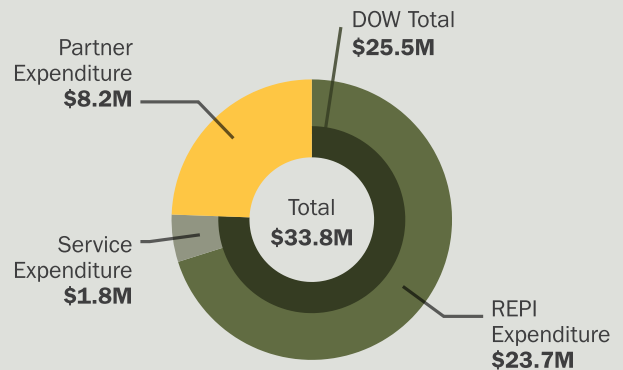

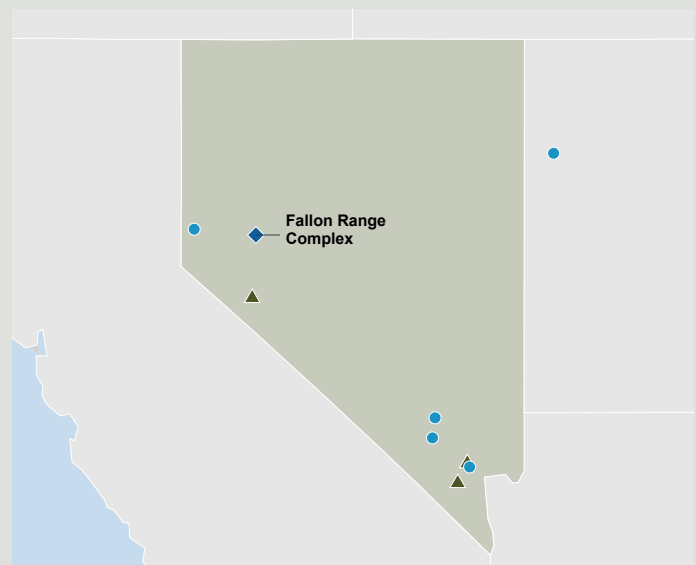

REPI Installations and Ranges

MILITARY PRESENCE

- NAS Fallon is home to the Naval Fighter Weapons School, the Carrier Airborne Early Warning Weapons School, and the Navy Rotary Wing Weapons School.
- The Nevada Test and Training Range is the largest contiguous air and ground space for peacetime military operations in the world.
- Nellis Air Force Base (AFB) is home to the 57th Wing, the largest composite flying wing of the U.S. Air Force, and the Thunderbirds, the renowned Air Demonstration squadron.
- NAS Fallon is known as the Navy's "carrier in the desert" due to its expansive and unique training facilities and year-round optimal weather conditions. The surrounding area contains 240,000 acres of bombing and electronic warfare ranges and the Fallon's 14,000-foot runway is the longest in the Navy.
- Creech AFB is home to the 432nd Wing, which operates MQ-9 Reaper and MQ-1 Predator unmanned aerial vehicles all across the globe.
