

Camp Blanding's Chauncey one of four new board member to North Florida Land Trust | Clay Today

JACKSONVILLE – North Florida Land Trust has welcomed four new members to its board of directors. Retired Brigadier General Paul "Trey" Chauncey, Megan Coughlin, retired Navy Captain Rick Hoffman and Pastor Carlton Jones began their service to the nonprofit land conservation organization in January. Each will serve a term of three years.

Gen. Chauncey served 38 years of combined service to the U.S. Army and Florida National Guard before his retirement in 2021. He was Assistant Adjutant General for the Florida Army National Guard where his duties included the strategic direction and oversight for Camp Blanding Joint Training Center and State and Federal Cooperative Agreement programs including the Army Compatible Use Buffer Program and the Department of Defense Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration Program.

Gen. Chauncey earned a master of science in strategy from the U.S. Army War College, a post-graduate certificate in advanced logistics and technology from the University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill and an executive certificate in public leadership from Harvard University. He currently owns and operates a land, timber and cattle business on his family's homestead in Suwannee County.

Megan Coughlin is an attorney in Jackson Lewis P.C.'s Jacksonville office where her practice focuses on representing employers in workplace law matters including litigation and preventive advice and counseling.

Retired Navy Captain Rick Hoffman is the founder and CEO of Orion Solutions, LLC. Captain Hoffman established the company after retiring from the U.S. Navy in 2003 after 28 years of service. He commanded the USS De Wert and the USS Hue City, both homeported in Mayport.

Pastor Carlton Jones is chair of the Renaissance Group and is the pastor and co-founder of the Gateway to Heaven Christian Church. Jones has more than 46 years of experience in public and private development. He is a licensed general contractor and real estate salesperson.

The inclusion of General Chauncey, Coughlin, Captain Hoffman and Pastor Jones to the board brings the total number of board members to 18. The board also recently made some officer changes. John Delaney will continue his position as chair, Matt Rapp has taken over as vice-chair, former vice-chair David Barton was named secretary and Patrick Carney will continue his role as treasurer.
