



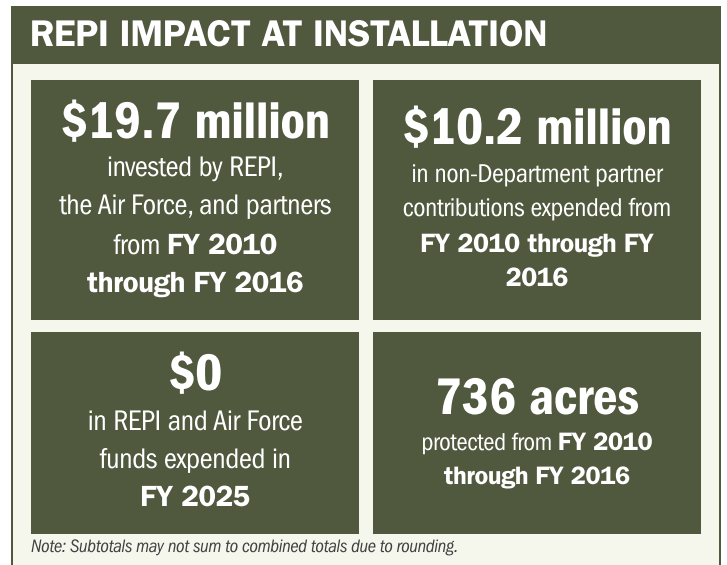
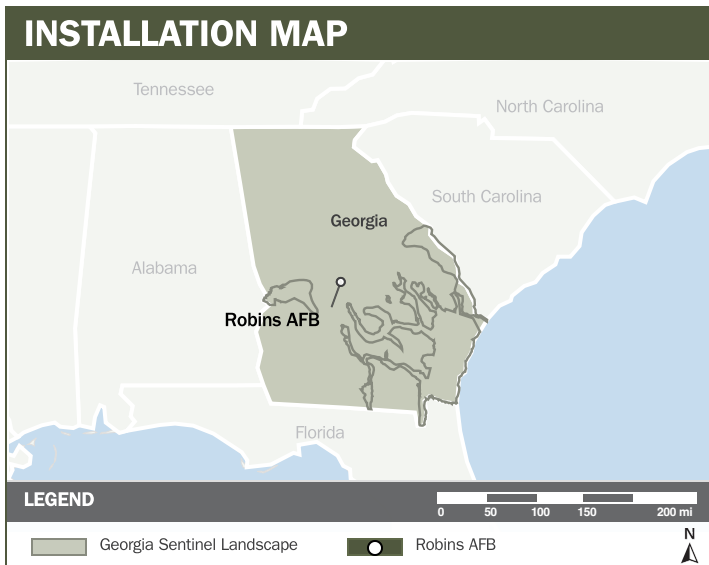

ABOUT THE INSTALLATION

Robins Air Force Base (AFB) is home of the 78th Air Base Wing and its 54 mission partners and is a vital part of the Air Force warfighting team. Located within the Georgia Sentinel Landscape, the installation is the largest single-site industrial complex in Georgia. The installation supports a broad range of mission capabilities, including strike, intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance, mobility, battlefield support, special tactics, and ground force training. Its integrated training environment enables combined air ground operations that mirror conditions found in current operational theaters, directly enhancing combat effectiveness.

STRENGTHENING MISSION READINESS THROUGH REPI INVESTMENTS

The Department of War's (DoW) Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program has played a critical role in supporting Robins AFB's long-term operational success. Through strategic land conservation and partnership-driven investments, REPI funding has helped prevent incompatible development, preserve training flexibility, and sustain critical capabilities beyond the installation boundary.



PROJECT OVERVIEW

INCOMPATIBLE DEVELOPMENT—10 U.S.C. § 2684A

- Robins AFB's mission depends on conserving surrounding lands and preventing urban development that exacerbates on-base flooding.
- Conservation and restrictive-use easements help reduce development pressures that threaten mission sustainment and operational continuity.
- Leveraging REPI funding under 10 U.S.C. § 2684A, the installation is protecting mission-critical capabilities from incompatible development, stormwater runoff, and riverine flooding impacts.

PROJECT OVERVIEW (CONTINUED)

NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT—10 U.S.C. § 2684A

- Robins AFB faces flooding threats that impact base operations.
- These floods halt mission critical operations by temporarily blocking segments of installation roads and flood parking areas.
- Leveraging REPI Program funds under 10 U.S.C. § 2684A, REPI investments will help reduce and control eastward stormwater flow during flood events. These efforts lower flood and fire risk, protect depot maintenance operations, enhance installation security, and safeguard habitat for migratory birds and the Central Georgia black bear.



KEY FISCAL YEAR MILESTONES AT ROBINS AFB*

2009 Robins AFB received its first REPI funding, establishing the first project at the installation to protect mission critical air and ground training.

2018 The Georgia Sentinel Landscape was officially designated with Robins AFB as an anchoring installation.

* These milestones demonstrate how the installation is strategically utilizing the REPI Program to mitigate encroachment risks and enhance mission assurance. While not exhaustive, the list highlights the various approaches installations are using to preserve critical testing and training capabilities essential to national defense.
