



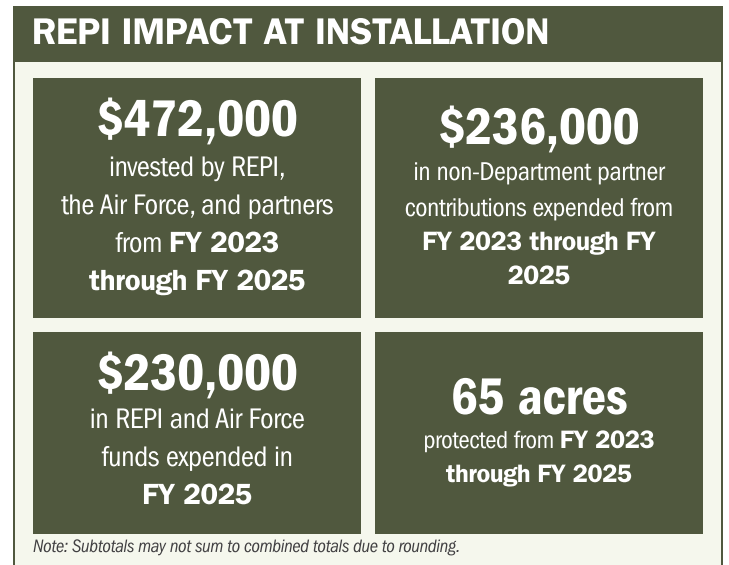
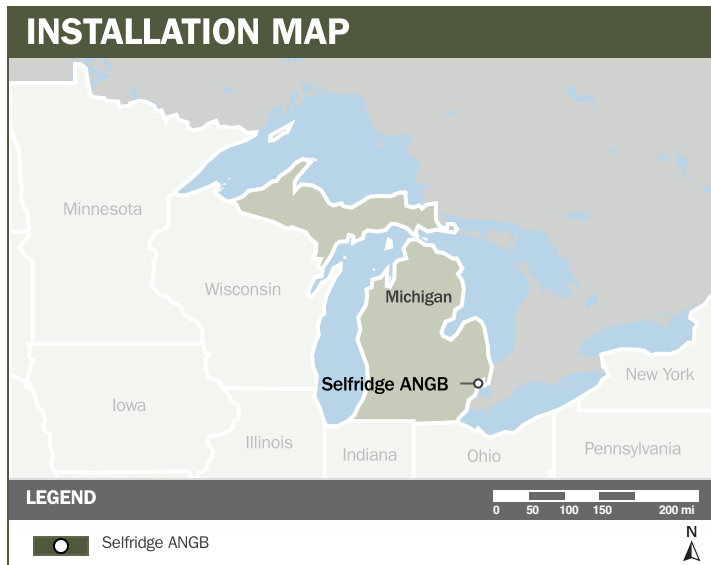
# SELFRIDGE ANGB

## ABOUT THE INSTALLATION

Selfridge Air National Guard Base (ANGB) is home to personnel from five of the nation's six military services and plays a crucial role in supporting flying and ground missions. The 127th Wing, Michigan Air National Guard, provides air support to two MAJCOMS through A-10 Thunderbolt and KC-135R/T Stratotanker refueling aircraft operations. Additionally, SANGB provides Army aviation support with CH-47 Chinook helicopters. Selfridge ANGB is also home to U.S. Coast Guard Air Station Detroit and the Department of Homeland Security's Great Lakes Air and Marine Branch. It is the busiest active Coast Guard station in the U.S, protecting U.S. economic and security interests in the Great Lakes.

## STRENGTHENING MISSION READINESS THROUGH REPI INVESTMENTS

The Department of War's (DoW) Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program has played a critical role in supporting Selfridge ANGB long-term operational success. Through strategic land conservation and partnership-driven investments, REPI funding has helped prevent incompatible development, preserve flight training flexibility, and sustain critical mission capabilities beyond the installation boundary.



## PROJECT OVERVIEW

### INCOMPATIBLE DEVELOPMENT—10 U.S.C. § 2684A

- Selfridge ANGB faces increased risks by residential and commercial development in Accident Potential Zones (APZs).
- The approach and departure of all flying missions may be impacted by encroachment from incompatible land uses under the Air Installations Compatible Use Zones (AICUZ) program. Additionally, Bird Aircraft Strike Hazard (BASH) risks could increase due to incompatible development, such as floodplain mitigation efforts and the construction of detention and retention ponds that are inconsistent with Federal Aviation Administration Advisory Circular guidance.

## PROJECT OVERVIEW (CONTINUED)

- To combat these encroachment threats, the installation is working with Six Rivers Land Conservancy and the REPI Program to acquire easements and address remaining encroachment concerns for the APZs. This will help ensure compatibility within the installation's AICUZ areas, and continuing the sustained success of mission programs, future host missions, and warfighter readiness.

## KEY FISCAL YEAR MILESTONES AT SELFRIDGE ANGB\*

**2020** Macomb County received \$293,000 for the Selfridge Sustainability Study (S3) from the DoW and Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation.

**2021** The installation completed an Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation (OLDCC) Installation Readiness Program study.

**2022** REPI signed an agreement with Six Rivers Land Conservancy to prevent encroachment around the base, initiating the first REPI project at the installation.

\* These milestones demonstrate how the installation is strategically utilizing the REPI Program to mitigate encroachment risks and enhance mission assurance. While not exhaustive, the list highlights the various approaches installations are using to preserve critical testing and training capabilities essential to national defense.
